(Completion requirements)

Students must be enrolled in the doctoral program for at least three years, earn the prescribed credits by taking classes of courses required for completion as specified for each program, receive the necessary research guidance, and pass the thesis defense and final examination. However, with regard to the period of enrollment, for those who have made outstanding achievements, it is sufficient for them to be enrolled for at least one year (three years including the period of enrollment in the relevant program in the case of those who have completed their master's program early, etc.).

(Note) If deemed educationally beneficial, credits earned by taking classes of courses in other programs may be accepted as credits toward completion, within the limit as determined by each program.
